Please make sure that you have signed up to the school app.

Tips for users

- 1. Start at the Home page and tap the menu tiles to find your way around the app.
- 2. The Timeline tile contains a record of the alert messages you have been sent by the school. The Badge counter will alert you to messages from school.
- 3. On the Settings page (reached via 'More' tile on Home page, then scroll to bottom of menu), you can filter the alert messages you receive. Please select 'Urgent alerts' these are urgent messages intended for everyone. Please also select the year groups/ classes your children are currently in.
- 4. It is a good idea to turn the app off when not in use. This allows content to refresh and you will not miss anything urgent since alert messages will pop up on your phone even when the app is off.

JOIN THE GREAT BRITISH SPRING CLEAN 2024

Back for its ninth year, the Great British Spring Clean is the nation's biggest mass-action environmental campaign.

The Great British Spring Clean and Great Big School Clean 2024 will take place from 15 - 31 March, and you can pledge to pick up a bag of litter – or more.

The eco council in school have already started doing their bit and more classes will be getting involved next week.

THE ENVIRONMENT BELONGS TO EVERY-ONE

This year we are spreading the word that the environment belongs to everyone! We are proud that hundreds of thousands #LitterHeroes from many different communities are uniting to help tackle litter – some of which has been in our environment since we were founded 70 years ago.

Many of our volunteers regularly find 'retro rubbish' that was dropped many years ago but is still causing harm to our environment today, releasing greenhouse gases as it slowly breaks down in our soil and water, which contributes to the climate crisis.

The good news is that litter-picking is a simple action that anyone can do. It makes an immediate and visible difference to the environment where we live, work and play. In fact around 95% of people surveyed after 2023's campaign agreed they felt they had made a difference to their local area, and 91% said they felt part of a national movement that is taking action to tackle litter.

So, if you want to protect our wildlife and the places you love this spring, join the Great British Spring Clean and pledge to pick up a bag – or more.

Can we also please remind people to use the bins provided in the school playgrounds. Especially at the start and the end of the school day.

The planting outside the North site is really beginning to take shape. We do not know when it will be finished but we hope it will become a community garden like the planters are outside the south site. A big Thank you to the parents who help maintain those beds. They are looking beautiful at the moment.


