We had a staff training day on Monday and the children started back and got straight into lessons Tuesday morning. I know for year 1 parents it was a bit of a shock saying goodbye in the playground and the children going straight into lessons and that some of you have not met the teachers. I am sorry about this and we will change it next year. You will have an opportunity to meet the teachers at our coffee morning in a couple of weeks.

At the coffee mornings we will be raising funds for Macmillan Cancer Charity. The children will be making biscuits and cakes for the event so please bring some money.

The children from Reception to Year 6 have their own water bottle in class and it is their house colour and has their name on it. These will stay in school and we will be encouraging the children to drink lots of water. A good night's sleep is vital. And for children, a decent night's sleep will help them to do better at school, allow them to react more quickly to situations, have a more developed memory, learn more effectively and solve problems. Plus it will make them less susceptible to colds and other minor ailments, less irritable and better behaved!

As a general rule of thumb toddlers need around 12 hours of sleep a night; children aged four to six – 10.5–11.5 hours; six–12 years olds – 10 hours; and teenagers – around eight to nine hours.

As the new school term kicks in, we've been actively encouraging parents to think about coaching their kids into a healthy bedtime routine following the upheaval of the summer school holidays.
