And for children, a decent night's sleep will help them to do better at school, allow them to react more quickly to situations, have a more developed memory, learn more effectively and solve problems. Plus it will make them less susceptible to colds and other minor ailments, less irritable and better behaved!

As a general rule of thumb toddlers need around 12 hours of sleep a night; children aged four to six – 10.5–11.5 hours; six–12 years olds – 10 hours; and teenagers – around eight to nine hours.

As the new school term kicks in, we've been actively encouraging parents to think about coaching their kids into a healthy bedtime routine following the upheaval of the summer school holidays.
