🔼 3. Be Bright, Be Seen!


Wear bright or reflective clothes, especially in the dark or bad weather.

Road Safety Tips:

For Riding in a Car

- Always wear a seatbelt Even on short trips.
- Use a booster seat Until you're tall enough for a regular seatbelt to fit properly.
- Never distract the driver Stay calm and quiet while the car is moving.
- Get in and out safely Always use the door on the pavement side, not the road side.

For Cycling or Scootering

- Wear a helmet It protects your head if you fall.
- Check your bike or scooter Make sure brakes and tires work properly.
- Wear bright or reflective clothing So drivers can see you.
- Ride in safe places Like bike lanes, parks, or quiet roads with an adult.
- Follow traffic rules Stop at red lights and look for cars at driveways.
