Mary was born in Kingston, Jamaica. Her father was a Scottish army officer and her mother was Jamaican and made medicines from plants. Mary was called a 'doctress' because she was able to cure common illnesses. She learned about medicine from her mother.

Mary is remembered for her humanitarian work and her courage to challenge social, political and cultural values of the Victorian Age.



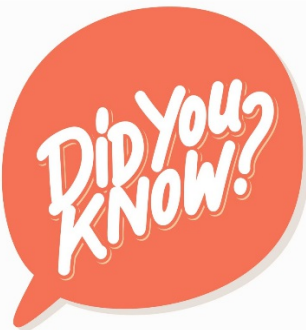
Florence Nightingale

Florence Nightingale is important because she was a nurse who saved many lives during the Crimean War.

In Victorian Britain girls would usually do house work, crafts or charity work but Florence was educated and interested in medicine.

Florence helped to figure out ways to keep hospitals cleaner and trained more nurses so that they could help ill people to get better.

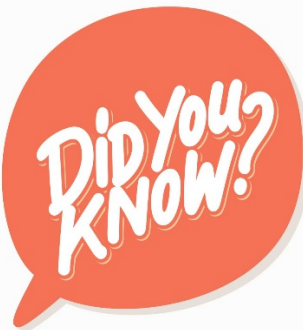

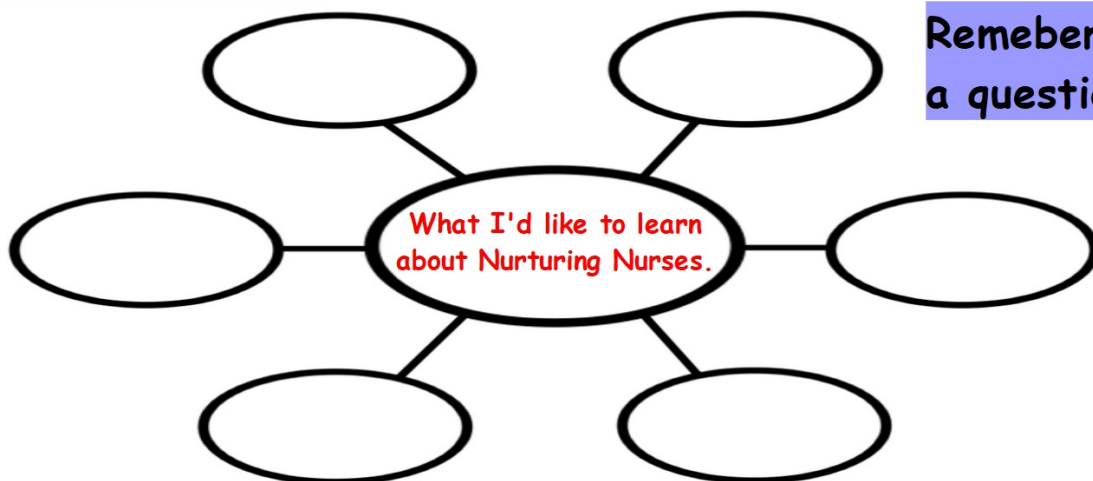
