<p>1. Writing – Biome Fact File</p> <p>Create a fact file about one biome of your choice.</p> <p>Include: location, climate, vegetation, animals, and human impact. Add illustrations or diagrams.</p>	<p>2. Reading & Research – Biome Report</p> <p>Read an article or watch a video about your biome.</p> <p>Write a short report summarising the key points. Add two questions for a friend to answer.</p>	<p>3. Maths – Biome Statistics</p> <p>Research average rainfall and temperature for your biome.</p> <p>Make a graph or chart to show your data. Compare it with another biome and describe the differences.</p>
<p>4. Geography – Biome Map</p> <p>Draw a world map and label where your biome is found.</p> <p>Colour-code different biomes with a key.</p> <p>Add a few icons for plants and animals typical of each biome.</p>	<p>5. Art – Biome Collage</p> <p>Create a collage or painting of your biome.</p> <p>Include plants, animals, and the landscape.</p> <p>Be creative—use magazines, coloured paper, or natural materials.</p>	<p>6. DT – Biome Model</p> <p>Build a 3D model of a biome using clay, cardboard, or recycled materials.</p> <p>Include at least 3 plants and 3 animals.</p>

Cooking – Biome Meal</p> <p>Research food from a region within your biome (e.g., tropical fruits for a rainforest).</p> <p>Prepare a simple dish or snack inspired by the biome.</p> <p>Take a photo and write the recipe.</p>	<p>8. Science – Plant Adaptations</p> <p>Choose one plant from your biome.</p> <p>Describe how it has adapted to survive (e.g., cactus storing water).</p> <p>Draw and label the plant.</p>	<p>9. Creative Writing – A Day in the Biome</p> <p>Imagine you are living in your biome for a day.</p> <p>Write a diary entry describing what you see, hear, and do.</p> <p>Include encounters with plants, animals, and the weather.</p>
